

# a gift of learning.

Going back to school to receive her bachelor's degree in nursing, was an inspiring experience for JoAnn Miller-Watts. As a registered nurse on the ortho-neuro unit at St. Charles Bend since 1982, Miller-Watts said she was accustomed to St. Charles' healing health philosophy.

Through school, she interacted with nurses from all over the country and realized that St. Charles' focus on patient-centered care is different than at other health care institutions.

"I could see the difference between care at St. Charles and the rest of the country," Miller-Watts said. "It was inspiring to talk about it."

Miller-Watts, along with six other nurses in 2010, received support from the St. Charles Foundation scholarship program to continue her education. As a school project, she spent more than a year developing a Total Joint Replacement education program that has successfully helped hundreds of patients prepare for surgery.

Since completing her degree, Miller-Watts has taken on a new role at St. Charles as a Lean practitioner, helping caregivers throughout the organization be more efficient to provide even higher-quality patient care at a lower cost.

For June Overberg, volunteering at St. Charles Redmond is a way to ensure the health not only of the hospital but also of her community.

“A vibrant community depends on a state-of-the-art hospital,” Overberg said. “The hospital is an institution that touches everybody’s life. It’s probably the only institution that does that.”

For more than a decade, Overberg has helped with the St. Charles Redmond Volunteers Golf Tournament and the annual fashion show the volunteers host every fall – frequently serving as chair for one or both events which raise a combined average of more than \$10,000 a year.

In addition to her role with the volunteers, Overberg kicked off a community fundraising campaign in 2010 to raise dollars for the expansion of the Emergency Department and a remodel of the Family Birthing Center. Her \$20,000 gift was the foundation that encouraged caregivers, physicians, other volunteers and community members to donate a total of \$200,000 to the projects.

# peggy and teresa



A cancer diagnosis can be overwhelming.

That's when Peggy Lukens and Teresa Braden, cancer nurse navigators, step in to help. From diagnosis to survivorship, they are there to steer patients through the complexities of the health care system, providing clinical and emotional support.

In 2010, St. Charles was fortunate to receive nearly half a million dollars in gifts to grow its patient navigator program.

PacificSource Health Plans gave a \$250,000 gift to the St. Charles Foundation to fund a full-time cancer nurse navigator. PacificSource, which purchased Clear One Health Plans last year, made the donation in honor of Clear One founder Pat Gibford's contributions to the community.

LifeWise Health Plan of Oregon also gave a \$25,000 gift, to help fund a lung cancer nurse navigator. Additionally, the St. Charles Foundation has received commitments from donors for \$110,000 to go toward funding a general cancer nurse navigator and \$20,000 to support two heart nurse navigators.

These navigators will be available to provide emotional support to patients, whose jobs and relationships with family members may be impacted by their diagnosis.

"There's a huge need that you don't know about unless you reach out to these folks,"  
Lukens said.

The manager of the food services department at St. Charles Bend said he believes in showing his gratitude by supporting St. Charles Health System – and he has encouraged his fellow caregivers to do the same. In the fall of 2010, Brown was one of several St. Charles employees who led the annual Caregiver Campaign, which raises funds through a partnership with the United Way , Crook County United Fund and the St. Charles Foundation.

“I think St. Charles Health System is a really great place to work and I want to be a part of a group that is helping to give back,” Brown said.

Last year the Caregiver Campaign raised more than \$43,000 to support renovation projects, new equipment, education programs and more for the St. Charles Bend, St. Charles Redmond and Pioneer Memorial Hospital facilities.

“At the Foundation, we find it inspiring that these caregivers, who know St. Charles best, are willing to support the organization through their generous donations,” said John Jepson, senior philanthropy officer for the St. Charles Foundation.

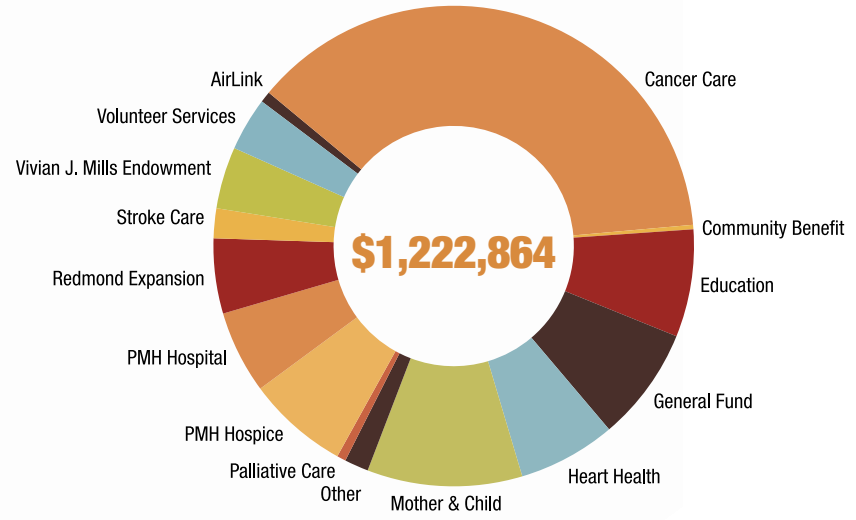

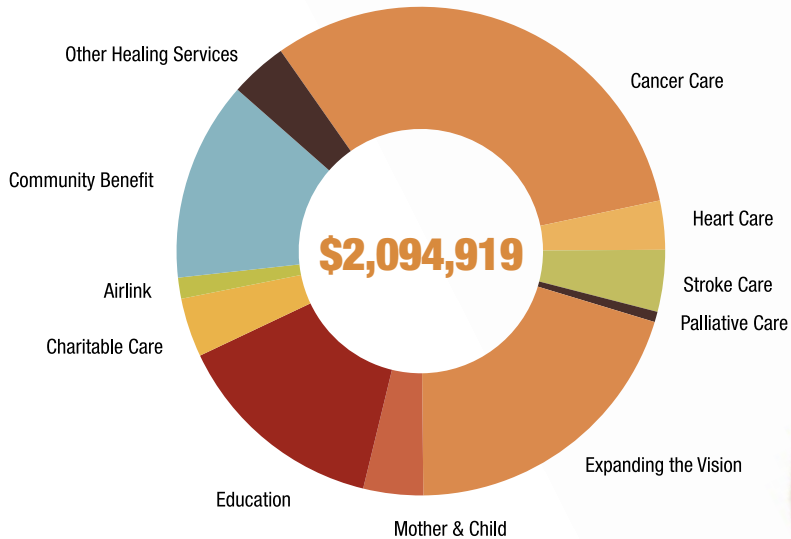
